- Nathan Lee Oglesby, of Fort Worth, Texas, pleaded guilty to A and B misdemeanor unlawful possession of drug paraphernalia. He was ordered to pay \$325 in fees. He was sentenced to 10 days' confinement at the Heart of America Correctional & Treatment Center, with one day's credit for time served.

The court dismissed an A misdemeanor charge of unlawful possession of drug paraphernalia against Charles Francis Stoney (Fargo).
