Panthers travel to Oakes

The Rugby High School Panthers ended their regular football season with a shutout win against the Bottineau Braves last weekend. The Panthers head into state championship play with a 7-2 record and a third seed playoff berth in Oakes today against the Tornados at Cummings Field. The game begins at 2:00 p.m.

The playoff picture is set. The Region 2 no. 3-seed St. John Woodchucks travel to Mayville State for a game against Region 1 no. 2-seed Mayville-Portland-Clifford-Galesburg. The game starts at 7 p.m. tonight.

Region 2 no. 4-seed North Prairie Cougars travel to Hope today to take on no. 2-ranked Finley-Sharon-Hope-Page.

The Woodchucks ended the regular season last week with a 36-20 win at home over the Cougars. The Woodchucks go into the playoffs with a 7-2 record, and the Cougars a 6-3 record.

Region 2 no. 2-seed New Rockford-Shenoyne will travel to Casselton to take on Tri-State (a/k/a Fairmount/Campbell-Tintah, Minn./Rosholt, S.D.), the third seed in Region 1. New-Rockford defeated the Dunseith Dragons 70-12 last week in Minot.

The Dragons ended their season with a 3-6 overall record, while the Rockets go into the playoffs with only one loss on the season (a 22-20 loss to Cavalier).

The Benson County Wildcats ended the regular season on a high note, getting their first win of the season in a 38-28 win at home over the North Star Bearcats. The Bearcats end their season with a 1-7 record and the Wildcats a 1-8 record.

The Towner-Granville-Upham Titans ended the regular season with a 34-8 road loss to Ray-Powers Lake. The Titans end the season with a 3-6 record.

Drake-Anamoose wins 6-man

It wasn't pretty, but the Drake-Anamoose Raiders managed to pull off a 70-68 win over the Center-Stanton Wildcats in the Independent 6-man State Championship last week.

The Raiders ended the first quarter with a 20-14 over the Wildcats, however the latter managed to go into halftime with a 28-26 lead over the former.

The Wildcats would continue to have the lead by the end of the third, with the scoreboard at 48-42.

The Raiders then turned the tables, scoring 28 points to the Wildcats' 20 in the fourth quarter for the win.

Extension accepting applications for Master Gardener program

If you love gardening and sharing your knowledge with others, consider becoming a Master Gardener volunteer in collaboration with North Dakota State University Extension.

The NDSU Extension Master Gardener program is a volunteer service organization that beautifies communities, educates the public about gardening, works with youth and encourages conservation of natural resources.

The next Master Gardener training program will run for 10 weeks beginning Jan. 24 and ending April 3, 2020. Classes will not be held on March 20.

Those enrolled in the course who live near Fargo can attend the live class every Friday from 9 a.m. to noon on the NDSU campus.

The majority of the participants will take the class online. "Online students can log in on their computers and participate in the live Friday morning classes," says Esther McGinnis, NDSU Extension horticulturist and Extension Master Gardener director. "Alternatively, students can watch the recorded lectures at a more convenient time. These online options allow students to continue taking the class even if they are wintering in another state."

Course topics include annual and perennial flowers, tree selection and maintenance, soil health, composting, pollinator plants, plant diseases and insects, vegetable and fruit production, and lawn maintenance. NDSU faculty and Extension personnel teach the classes.

Once participants complete the training, they are known as Master Gardener interns. They must volunteer 48 hours of time during a two-year period on horticultural projects in cooperation with NDSU Extension. After that, they will be certified as Master Gardeners.

Potential volunteer projects include answering gardening questions in the Extension office, organizing horticultural workshops, managing school and community gardens, designing and maintaining pollinator gardens, and providing horticultural therapy.

Tuition for the 2020 class is \$225 plus a background check fee of \$35 for those wishing to become a certified Extension Master Gardener or \$450 for the nonvolunteer option. High-speed internet access, computer knowledge and an email account are required.

Twenty North Dakota counties will be accepting a limited number of Master Gardener applications. The application deadline is Nov 18. Application forms and a list of counties that are accepting applications are available at <http://www.ag.ndsu.edu/mastergardener/>.
